The instruments studied shall include clarinet, flute, oboe or bassoon, and saxophone. - Basic sound production
- Proper embouchure
- Instrument assembly
- Proper posture and hand position
- Accepted conventional fingerings

 octave major scale, and a one octave chromatic scale. The starting pitch of the
 scales shall be specified by the instructor.
- Demo Teaching Lesson: Students shall submit a 10-15 minute video of a beginning woodwind lesson that you teach to someone that has never played the instrument previously. Students will receive an outline of the lesson expectations.
 Videos are due on or before Monday, December 6, 2021.
- The Written Reflection will be available on HuskyCT and will be returned to me via HuskyCT on or before Friday, December 3, 2021.
- Practice Videos: In addition to classroom demonstrations, students will submit a
 7-10 minute weekly practice video via your cell phone, or a digital device of your
 choosing. Videos should be recorded and uploaded to Kaltura, and then shared
 to HuskyCT. If the use of or access to technology presents an issue, other
 arrangements can be made with the instructor. Videos are due as directed on
 Monday evenings by 11:59 P.M.
